During a weekend about vocation, organized by Jozua Alblasserdam church, I was given the chance to briefly tell something about my experiences. By the way, it was wonderful to see how many people attended the conference!

I also have some very special news: if all goes well, a novel I have written will be published in the autumn.

This has been a wish of mine for a long time, and I have always promised myself that if I had to stay in the Netherlands in 2024, I would do my best for publication. It is a detective novel, in
